

Student Transfers

With the Spring 2019 semester coming to a close, many WCJC students will begin the process of transferring to a four-year college or university to complete their baccalaureate degrees. As of academic year (AY) 2018, WCJC maintained the third highest three-year transfer rate in the state and the highest rate of transfer for all schools in our Gulf Coast Community College (CC) peer group. The graph below compares the transfer rate of WCJC students to the median rates for our Medium CC peer group, Gulf Coast CC peer group, and State of Texas, as a whole.
