### Course Learning Outcomes:

**Learning Outcomes – Upon successful completion of this course, students will:**

1. Play additional major and minor scales and arpeggios.
2. Harmonize melodies using varied accompaniment techniques.
3. Perform selected compositions.

**Methods of Assessment:**

1. Play all twelve major scales, hands together.
2. Play all twelve major cadences in three positions, hands together.
3. Play all twelve major arpeggios, hands separately or together.
4. Play all twelve minor scales, hands together
5. Play all twelve minor cadences in three positions, hands together.
6. Play all twelve major arpeggios, hands separately or together.
7. Harmonize simple melodies through the secondary dominant.
8. Sight read piano repertoire two levels below the performance level.
9. Transpose music in any key.
10. Complete 3-6 repertoire pieces of differing styles.

### List any specific or physical requirements beyond a typical classroom required to teach the course.

Piano Lab with sixteen keyboard stations for students; one master control station; one acoustical piano; ear phones; tie-in cables from the keyboard stations to the master control station; white board containing permanent music staves.

Students must be prepared to demonstrate increased skills in assigned materials and will receive a weekly grade accordingly.

They must perform a recital or a jury by playing at least two selections from repertoire assigned during the semester. The student must also present an hourly practice time schedule each week and have practiced a minimum of 4 1/2 hours per week.

The final grade will be assessed from the weekly grades, recitals, jury and practice times throughout the semester.
